

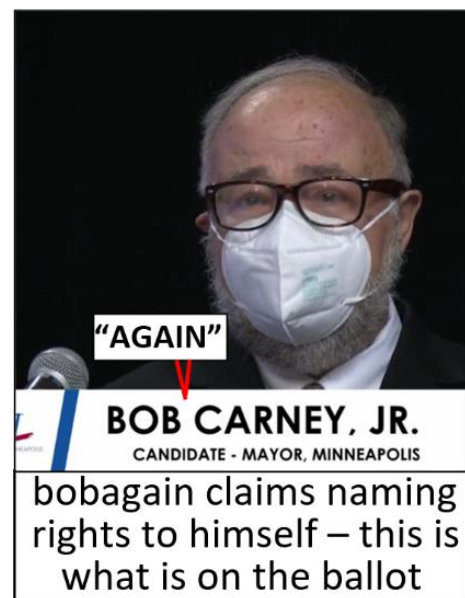

Minneapolis, MN, 9/16/2021 – At a Monday League of Women Voters televised Mayoral Forum, Republican candidate for Mayor and self-described “candidate-journalist” Bob “Again” Carney Jr., (bobagain) announced he was declaring the plaza at the Hennepin County Government Center a “Peaceable Assembly Zone” for “politically homeless” people. Here’s a transcript of bobagain’s closing statement: “Hi, Bob ‘Again’ Carney Jr., again I’m the only Republican on the panel. So I want to talk a little bit about the importance of having a robust Republican party participating in politics both at the level of the urban core cities and around the state. I think it’s very important to our state to have two competitive parties. I describe myself as a ‘candidate-journalist’ and I’m going to be investigating the recent sex trafficking and the ‘gold-cash’ scandal involving Tony Lazzaro; he’s a Republican operative and he’s in jail right now. We need to find out more about how Trumpism has been controlling the Republican party and we need to stop it cold. I’ve been very encouraged about listening to everybody here, it’s been a very good and thoughtful discussion. I’m inviting everybody to a Peaceable Assembly Zone for politically homeless people at the Hennepin County Center, that’s the site of the 2011 Occupy movement. I’m going to be down there Wednesday starting that. We need to have discussions among everybody about what the future of our city will be.”
